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Dear Members,

Please join me in welcoming Mr Koh Jin Kit who was elected Committee Member during the recent 60th Annual General Meeting (AGM). I would also like to express my sincere appreciation to outgoing Committee Member, Mr James Tan, for his contributions and commitment during his 2-year term in office as the Human Resource Chairperson.

The AGM was attended by 148 principal members. Three resolutions were tabled and two were carried. I am heartened to see members sharing their views on the proposed resolutions for the betterment of the Club. The two resolutions passed were: reelection eligibility for Honorary Treasurer and Assistant Honorary Treasurer to allow continuity and to cater for succession planning, and revision to the disciplinary investigation process to provide the Disciplinary Committee the discretion to call a member to answer a charge only if there is both sufficient evidence and the allegations are of sufficient gravity.

I am glad to inform members that we are seeing improvements in our financial standing. The Club achieved a net surplus of \$701k compared to a surplus of \$360k in the previous year, after factoring in depreciation, gain / loss on disposal of property, plant and equipment, and tax. We witnessed an increase in net income in Sports & Recreation (S&R) through new programmes and initiatives. The Facilities, Maintenance & Safety team did well in containing repair and maintenance cost, and utilities cost. Banquet sales, having been affected by Heliconia Wing's lift modernisation project in the last financial year, have since seen the team ramp up its efforts to improve sales. To date, it has secured \$1.75 million in confirmed bookings, achieving 70% of the target of \$2.5 million for the new financial year 2017 / 2018. More activities, classes, events, promotions, and F&B initiatives are in the pipeline to increase members' patronage and spending in the Club. We have recently installed perforated boards to the walls of the Atrium Cafe after receiving members' feedback on unwanted noise. With this installation, we hope to provide a more pleasant dining experience for our members.

In June 2017, we hosted the 11th SGCC-Prince Squash Open and attracted over 150 participants from various schools and clubs in Singapore. We received excellent feedback from all the participants for a well-organised event. Many thanks to the Squash fraternity, sponsors and S&R team for their efforts in making the tournament a success. We will be organising a new kids' martial art class, Judo. Parents looking into letting your little ones pick up self-defense skills can sign up with our S&R team.

On 6 August 2017, we will be celebrating National Day and the SGCC Heritage at the Main Lobby from 11am. We will be officially launching our much-awaited SGCC Coffee Table Book titled Serangoon Gardens Country Club – Our Heritage, Our Pride, Our Future. Many other exciting activities await you – mass Zumba with resident instructor Rasidah, Muay Thai and Judo demonstrations, traditional games and National Day song sing-alongs. You will also get to feast on delicious traditional snacks. Bring your family and friends and join in

the festivities. For the month of August, we will be introducing a special cocktail, *SGCC Sling*, at the Crossroads Lounge and Club Twenty-Two. Try it and share with us your feedback.

During the September school holiday, we will be having our annual Junior Gems Party with a dinosaur theme. There will be carnival games and snacks, fossil digging and colouring activities, and magic show. Our last *Pyjamas Movie Night* featuring *Trolls* was a success and we are screening another film this coming Children's Day, 6 October 2017. Catch *Smurfs: The Lost Village* with us at the Kensington Ballroom; remember to come dressed as your favourite character and stand a chance to walk away with attractive prizes.



60TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 24 June 2017

Club President, Mr Randy Sng, called the meeting to order at 1.03pm. He then invited Trustee, Mr Hendrick Koh, to present a token of appreciation to outgoing General Committee (GC) member, Mr James Tan, for having completed his two-year term of office.

Election of General Committee Member

Two nominations were received for one vacant position of Committee Member. The candidates, Mr Koh Jin Kit and Mr James Tan, were given the opportunity to introduce themselves before the attendees cast their votes.

President's Address

The President brought the House through the highlights of key initiatives and improvements: Heliconia Wing's lift modernisation, bowling lane replacement and air-conditioner replacement at various Club facilities.

He was pleased to share with members that the Club is now out of the transition period for the Financial Year (FY) 2016 / 2017, as its Financial Reserve of \$4.99 million exceeded the Minimum Financial Reserve (MFR) threshold of \$3.8 million by more than \$500k. The President also took the opportunity to clarify that the MFR threshold for FY 2017 / 2018 should be \$3.8 million, as according to Constitution Clause 26C.6, it cannot be lower than that of any preceding financial year.

The President then touched on the Club's financial standing. After factoring in depreciation, gain / loss on disposal of property, plant and equipment, and tax, the Club achieved

a net surplus of \$701k compared to a surplus of \$360k in the previous year. He commended the Sports Convenors and Sports & Recreation (S&R) team on increasing net income through new programmes and initiatives as well as the Facilities, Maintenance & Safety (FMS) team on containing repair and maintenance cost, and utilities cost. The President shared the Club's effort in improving banquet sales, previously affected by the lift modernisation project. To date, the Food & Beverage (F&B) team has secured \$1.75 million in confirmed banquet bookings, which is 70% of its FY 2017 / 2018 target of \$2.5 million.

Confirmation of Minutes and Adoption of Accounts

Mr Vincent Tan highlighted that 58% of members are aged 51 and above. He asked for staff to be trained in first aid to better cater to the needs of these members. The President acknowledged his concern and also proposed that the Club will explore organising such programmes for members.





Mr Roger Yap questioned the increase in bad debts to \$12,544 in FY 2016 / 2017. The Finance Manager, Ms Jamie Lai, highlighted the increase in the number of expelled members, as they failed to pay for their expenses on time. She assured members that the Finance team has stepped up their effort by monitoring and following up on borderline cases. Mr Vincent Tan asked how the Club manages late payments. The Finance Manager elaborated on the penalty charges and assured the House that most members do pay up and some members spend more during festive seasons, which happen to coincide with the closing of the financial year. Mr Tan sought clarification on why there were no "Donations" in this year's Annual Report. The Honorary Treasurer, Ms Wong Sook Yee, explained that the Club did not organise a charity event in FY 2016 / 2017, unlike in the year before when a charity dinner was held.

Mr Seck Pow Foo noted a 20% increase in the Club's cash reserves. He recommended that the Club enhance its investment policy to yield higher returns. Mr Moses Tan, Mr Tony Lim and Mr Sam Choo were against the idea, emphasising that the Club is a not-for-profit organisation. Mr Moses Tan and Mr Sam Choo added that it would not be fair to request such services from the GC when they are volunteers. The Treasurer clarified that under the Club's Constitution, only capital-guaranteed investments are allowed. To another suggestion that the Club invest in Singapore Government Securities (SGS), the Treasurer responded that it is something that the GC could explore. Mr Tony Lim suggested that the Club spend the money on improving its facilities and replacing ageing equipment instead.

Mr Teng Leng Hock questioned the lower F&B patronage. Vice-President, Mr Lee Say Yeow conceded that the previous increase in F&B prices might have had some impact. He also mentioned that the prices of some F&B items have been reduced to attract patronage. Dr Mark Leong suggested that such efforts be better publicised. Mr Puah Neo Peng Chiew encouraged having more promotions during lull periods and recommended creating unique food items.

Mr Koh Jin Kit sought clarification on the absence of the Gross Total Cost (GTC) and Gross Total Revenue (GTR) parameters in this year's Annual Report. In his opinion, this information is useful, especially for the union, for the computation of staff bonuses. The President declined to elaborate on this matter, citing confidentiality concerning the terms of collective agreement negotiations. Committee Member and the Human Resource (HR) Chairperson, Mr James Tan, elaborated that while such information may not be published, it can still be made available to the union upon request. Mr Koh also suggested that the capital expenditure table should have

priority rankings. The Vice-President assured the House that the Club has been strictly following the Treasury Safeguarding Framework (TSF) guidelines.

Mr Roger Yap questioned the deficit of \$254 in chess and the decision not to organise an Open tournament. The Vice-President, who is also Deputy S&R Chairperson, explained that the deficit resulted from organising two annual TCA tournaments, instead of one, in one financial year. Committee Member and Deputy S&R Chairperson, Mr Ansband Tan, responded that the Chess Open was not organised due to an insufficient number of participants. Committee Member and S&R Chairperson, Mr Gilbert Low, took the opportunity to encourage members to sign up for Club notifications to receive timely updates on the Club's sports programmes and activities.

The House then proceeded to receive the Annual Report, adopt the Accounts and appoint the Auditors for the ensuing year.



Resolutions

Resolution Item 1: To allow the Honorary Treasurer and Assistant Honorary Treasurer to be re-elected to the same or related position for a consecutive term

The President explained that the rationale behind this amendment is to ensure continuity in line with the President's term of office and also for succession planning. He also placed on record that the current Honorary Treasurer and Assistant Honorary Treasurer have no intention of seeking re-election and that this amendment would apply to future GCs.

Result of Hand Vote

For 49 Against 9

The motion was carried.

Resolution Item 2: To provide for a retiring Trustee and to allow for a retiring Trustee to be accepted by the Committee

Mr Vincent Tan, Mr Bob Mong and Mr Puah Neo Peng Chiew were not in favour of the proposed amendment, citing that such a move would cede too much power to the GC, possibly compromising the system when they experience differences of opinion; Trustees are appointed to act in the interest of members and members should be kept informed of the reasons for their retirement. Mr Tony Lim added that the Club has more than one Trustee precisely as a contingency. Mr Roger Yap supported the resolution, in view that the Trustee has to wait for an AGM for his resignation to be accepted.

Result of Hand Vote

For 14 Against 39

The motion was not carried.

Resolution Item 3: To provide Disciplinary Committee (or a member of the DC) the discretion to call on a member to answer charges only if there are both sufficient evidence and the allegations are of sufficient gravity to justify calling the Member to answer the charges

Committee Member, Mr Christopher Tan, who is also a member of the DC, explained the disciplinary process, starting from the Management investigating all written complaints and attempting to resolve them amicably. Mr Tan emphasised that calling a member to answer a charge at a substantive hearing is deemed a very serious matter. He also highlighted that an affected member who is aggrieved by the DC's decision has the right to appeal to the GC.

Mr Bob Mong questioned the possibility of the Management not taking any action on a case without a written complaint, with Mr Koh Jin Kit raising concerns that the complainant may not come forth in fear of harassment. In response, Mr Tan said that the staff may also lodge the complaint. Several members sought clarification on the component, "the allegations are of sufficient gravity". Mr Tan explained that it is difficult to have an exhaustive list of offences that constitute sufficient gravity. He concluded by saying that the GC undertakes to create guidelines.

Result of Hand Vote

For 30 Against 13

The motion was carried.

Any Other Business (AOB)

The topics covered in the letters received from Mr Thomas Cheok and Mr Bob Mong pertained to Resolution Item 3 and were addressed during the earlier discussion.

Adjournment of Meeting

The President ended the 60th Annual General Meeting at 4.13pm and members were invited to the Crossroads Lounge for a post-event reception.

Shower before entering the swimming pool
