his quote holds true for me as the culture of self interest and privilege has been severely curbed by the introduction of accountability and compliance. A good analogy that many can relate to is not closing a playground because of a bully; instead, you confront the bully and demonstrate that the playground is for everyone to enjoy.

It has been an honour to have served you for the past year, and I look forward to our future together as a Club, as we grow together. Being Members of a Club with as rich a heritage as Serangoon Gardens Country Club, we all feel passionate to take up the mantle to serve, in our own way, for the greater good of the Club. But in a Country Club of more than 6,000 Members (including Supplementary Members), we cannot deviate from our goals and growth just to suit a small group who are uncomfortable with change. The world around the Club is growing and everchanging. We must structure our expectations, and set realistic goals for our future.

Nothing changes overnight, and some changes, I admit, can seem daunting. But we should not let the fear of striking out stop us from playing the game. What is fair is rewarding Members who have consistently supported the Club by frequenting our F&B outlets, which is why we introduced an incentive programme for that very purpose. Fairness extends to introducing more mouthwatering F&B value offers that encourage and reward patronage, such as our Weekend Breakfast Specials and Weekday Kopi Tiam Sets, which are now very popular with Members. Fairness is ensuring that we do little changes and improvements in and around the Club, and introduce new and exciting programming that can excite potential Members, and increase the value of our Membership in the open market.

We approach the management of the Club with no fear or favour, and we need all Members to be mindful that we can only succeed in our transformation journey if we defy the odds. The purpose of the GC has always been, first and foremost, to support our Management team. They have, in my opinion, stepped up to the plate to make a real and positive difference for our Club. Our support means we're there to lend a helping hand, to give secondary opinions if needed, and to provide encouragement wherever necessary; but never to micro-manage, be utilitarian or commanding. They are, after all, part of our extended family, and must always be treated with grace and kindness.







ClubSpirit spoke to the director, TJ Taylor, who is also the Associate Artistic Director of Sing Theatre.

Why did Sing'Theatre choose to present A Spoonful of Sherman?

After seeing its tremendous success in the UK, we were inspired to bring this show to Singapore. With its strong family values, amazing songs, and message of unity, it fits perfectly with the values of Sing'Theatre. The show

From Neverland to Serangoon Gardens

In the second instalment of SGCC at the Theatre, the theme of childhood continues with W!LD RICE's year-end pantomime, Peter Pan in Serangoon Gardens.

The production's director and playwright reveal the inspiration to set it in Singapore.



heatre group WILD RICE has been entertaining audiences in Singapore and beyond for 19 years. In that time, it has won numerous fans for its high-quality and always entertaining productions. It has also built up a wide following beyond its core audience for its year-end pantomime. Since 2003, the company has successfully imprinted a Singaporean stamp on this British theatre tradition and given local twists to famous fairy tales.

"We're so proud that the W!LD RICE pantomime has evolved into one of the highlights of Singapore's theatre calendar," says Ivan Heng, its Artistic Director. "Our pantomimes have become a holiday tradition for so many families. Many children who grew up watching and performing in the shows are now adults. And it's also incredibly rewarding that many of them are working in our theatre industry."

Continuing The Tradition

This year, that tradition continues with Peter Pan in Serangoon Gardens. Premiering on 21 November 2019. Heng will be directing the production. As for the inspiration to set it in Serangoon Gardens, playwright Thomas Lim reveals that the original title of the tale by JM Barrie is Peter Pan in Kensington Gardens, thus Kensington Park condominium became the natural localised setting for the show!

More importantly, the decision to adapt Peter Pan was down to how it speaks to the nature of childhood in Singapore. "Peter Pan is also known as the boy who never grew up. That is very much unlike children here in Singapore, who all grow up very fast," explains Lim. "Not long after we are born, we are shuttled to schools and classes to prepare to be an adult, so much so that there is very little time to play. I think *Peter Pan* is a timely reminder to let our children be children. They only have one childhood."

While the resonances are clear, Lim admits that he had to grapple with certain aspects of cultural translation in his adaptation. "I had to think a lot about what certain things mean culturally. The Lost Boys are often seen dressed in animal costumes like the fox, bear and skunk, but not all



W!LD RICE sinks roots in own theatre

After 19 years in the theatre business, WILD RICE finally has a home to call its own at Funan, which opened in late June this year.

Known as W!LD RICE @ Funan, the theatre company will have a 358-seat theatre, a studio, and a production office within the shopping mall.

The theatre is uniquely configured with a thrust stage. This means that the stage extends into the audience, and audience members surround the stage on three sides. This not only creates an immersive experience for the audience and performers, it also allows the audience to face each other and acknowledge each other's presence and experience. "It provides an unparalleled sense of community," explains Ivan Heng, the company's Artistic Director.

Having one's own space is not about having the company's name on the façade of the mall. Rather, it provides a certain stability for the company to create "a supportive and conducive environment for everyone who wants to collaborate with us to create, develop and present new and exciting works," insists Heng.

Additionally, a mid-sized theatre enables the company to present longer runs at affordable ticket prices — something that will benefit audiences and the local theatre industry in the long run.

The new venue will be welcoming its first group of audience in August.

of them are native to Southeast Asia. Also, the idea of growing up means very different things to the English of the early 20th century compared to Singaporeans today.*

For Heng, the play serves as a reminder for adults to have the courage to dream. "It's a story about what it means to grow up while holding on to your ability to dream. At the same time, how do we hang on to a youthful spirit of adventure? How do we keep taking risks instead of growing stagnant in our lives? I find that tension in the *Peter Pan* story to be very true and inspiring. That also pretty much sums up what we're doing in building our own theatre in the heart of the city," adds Heng. Isee box story!

The stars of the show

Peter Pan in Serangoon Gardens will be headlined by local favourites Pam Oei (who plays Peter Pan) and Siti Khalijah Zainal (who plays Captain Hook), complemented by a talented group of local actors and First Stage Kids. Heng promises that the show would be an absolute treat. "Audience can expect to leave the theatre dancing on air," he assures.

No expense has been spared in this production. An international creative team, from as far afield as Canada, has been roped in for choreography, costumes and sets. To add the magic of flight to the show, W!LD RICE has hired a team of rigging experts who have worked with Cirque du Soleil. This is another aspect of the show that audiences will be excited about.

As for what the W!LD RICE's version of Neverland would be like, Lim has only this to say: "Imagine an island full of children... with no iPads."



What do you associate most with October? We are not surprised if Oktoberfest comes to mind. SGCC says "ja!" to going all out to celebrate this uniquely German festival that is now recognised around the world.

Origins

Oktoberfest is more than 200 years old. It originated in the city of Munich, located in the south German state of Bavaria, as the celebration of the royal wedding between Crown Prince Ludwig (later King Ludwig I of Bavaria) and Princess Therese of Saxe-Hildburghausen, which took place on 12 October 1810.

The month in which the wedding occurred explains the name of the festival. As it grew in popularity, the starting date was brought forward to mid- or late September to take

advantage of longer and warmer days, allowing guests to enjoy food and drink outdoors.

Interestingly, the residents of Munich refer to Oktoberfest as Wiesn, after the name of the fairgrounds on which the festival was held. The fields were renamed Theresienwiese (Therese's Meadow) in honour of the Crown Princess.

Customs

Oktoberfest always starts off with a parade by the tent owners and breweries to showcase the beautifully decorated horse wagons and big brass bands that feature in the festival tents. The parade is headed by the Münchner Kindl (Munich Child, the mascot of Oktoberfest), followed by the Mayor of Munich. One also associates Oktoberfest with traditional Bavarian costumes, collectively known as Tracht. On special occasions, such as Oktoberfest, men wear Lederhosen and women wear Dirndl.

Of course, Oktoberfest is known for its unique food and alcohol. *Bier* (beer) served can only come from six

traditional Munich-based breweries.
Augustiner, Paulaner, SpatenFranziskaner, Löwenbräu, HackerPschorr and Hofbräu. The tents
serving beer from these breweries are
often run by the same Munich-based
families for generations. You will also
find the traditional Bavarian sausage
— Weißwurst (white sausage) — being
served. There is a Bavarian saying
that the sausages should not be
allowed to hear the noon chime of
the church bells, hence they are

traditionally eaten before noon.

Oktoberfest at SGCC

Luckily, you won't have to fly to Munich — SGCC is bringing Oktoberfest to you!

Throughout October, enjoy delicacies such as Pumpkin Mole Chicken for \$12 per plate, Wiener Schnitzel (pork cutlet) for \$12 per plate. Roast Pork Knuckle for \$22 (for two persons), and Sausage Platter (veal, pork, and chicken) at \$20 (for two persons) at Crossroads Lounge and Club Twenty-Two from 6pm to 9.30pm. To quench your thirst, Carlsberg Draft (250ml) at \$3.50 per glass is also on offer!

Be sure not to miss the Oktoberfest Dance Party on Friday, 18 October 2019. It will be held at the Kensington Ballroom from 7:30pm to 11:30pm. Live Bavarian music and a buffet of German delicacies will be provided. Uniquely German dishes — such as Kartoffelsuppe (potato soup), Weißwurst. Schweinshaxe (crispy pork knuckle), Sauerkraut (pickled cabbage), and mini Schwarzwälder Kirschtorte (Black Forest gäteau) will be on offer. Entry costs \$32 for Members and \$42 for guests. Prices are subject to prevailing GST and inclusive of the buffet and a glass of Carlsberg beer.

Lai Recalls arry

Long-time SGCC Member Larry Lai — a former Rediffusion DJ who became a household name in the 1960s and 1970s - reminisces about his career.

t 79 years of age, Larry Lai still has that sonorous voice. a constant companion in households with a Rediffusion radio set.

*From a very young age, I listened to entertainment programmes by the BBC, such as Top of the Pops. I didn't intentionally try to emulate them," he muses. "But we've been taught in school to speak Queen's English."

Early Years

Lai moved to Singapore from Hong Kong in 1947, when he was seven years old. Growing up, his only links to music was his father's collection of Cantonese opera records and listening to the BBC through a small radio. While he had no ambitions of joining a radio station then, he did have his eye on the newspaper industry.

"My first ambition was to be a journalist. Unfortunately, when I left school, one of two English broadsheets closed down," he reveals. "All the reporters were absorbed by The Straits Times, so I knew there wouldn't be a chance for a cub reporter."

Instead, Lai worked in a trading company. Despite good prospects. Lai stayed on for only eight months. attracted by vacancies that opened up at Rediffusion.

The Rediffusion Years (1960-1978)

Lai remembers that about 300 applicants vied for two spots

The first round of interviews included general introductions and a written test. By the second stage, which required applicants to speak into a microphone, the number of applicants had been whittled down to 30.







Lai describes the third stage as an "acid test" conducted by someone who would become his boss.

Mike Ellery. The test involved Lai talking into a microphone for three minutes non-stop on any subject.

"Can you imagine? I scraped through by talking about the only thing I knew best: myself," Lai shares. Not surprisingly, Lai got the job.

Lai initially started as a radio announcer. No formal training was provided — he simply watched senior announcers between his shifts to learn the ropes. Lai went on to helm several shows: he played top 20 hits on the British charts on *Hit Parade*, introduced listeners to new records on *Disc Date*, and debated with colleagues whether a song was likely to be a hit on *Jukebox Jury*.

But it was the song request programmes that left the deepest impression. "We got two bags of postcards every day, and each bag had roughly 2.000 cards!" he explains. "The listeners took a lot of trouble decorating the postcards. I would also get a whole stack of postcards on the windshield of my car. It was impossible to entertain all the requests. A few announcers used to get threatening letters for not entertaining them!"

Lai's rise through the ranks was also thanks to the generosity of others, such as Len Thorne, who took over from Mike Ellery. Thorne started Rediffusion Discoveries, a talent show to discover new local bands. Recordings were held in a venue that could hold 1,500 people. When Thorne had to be

hospitalised, Lai was asked to stand in. After that, Thorne bequeathed the series to him. "It was really big of Len because it was a big show."

Lai left Rediffusion in 1978 as listenership had by then declined drastically due to two factors; governmental regulation meant that much of the station's popular Chinese dialect programming had to cease transmission, while the types of musical expressions by local bands were curtailed.

Life After Rediffusion

Towards the tail end of his Rediffusion career, Lai proposed to his former boss, Mike Ellery, that they set up a mobile disco — and Moby Dick was born.

"Nobody made disco equipment in those days, so I asked the Rediffusion engineers to build a little console with two turntables — something similar to what I used in the radio studio," says Lai. With the console and a few disco lights in the boot of their cars, Lai and Ellery would simply turn up at a venue, set up the console and lights, and provide disco entertainment on the spot. Moby Dick was a roaring success as both men took turns to travel to British military bases and expatriate clubs every weekend to provide entertainment.

Television soon came a-calling, and Lai was asked to host the Rado Show live for Singapore Broadcasting Corporation, a predecessor of Mediacorp. Lai remembers an unforgettable episode that was so plagued with technical glitches that he had to surreptitiously signal the

band to cut short its performance. While the band managed to do so, the show ate into the time allocated for the evening news by a minute.

"We knew that Lee Kuan Yew watched the news every night. After the show, we sat around waiting for the phone call, which thankfully never came." Lai says with a smile. His stint on the Rado Show led to more TV hosting gigs, most notably Talentime in 1980 and 1982.

With his vast experience in music and entertainment, he expanded his mobile disco into an events management company, which oversaw all sorts of product launches and factory openings.

When Lai finally retired in 2000, he had left behind a colourful career spanning four decades.


