House Wine

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PINOT GRIGIO

Italy

Straw-yellow appealing, brilliant reflections. It is a wine of great elegance, offering aromas of good intensity. It offers scents of white flowers combined with those of slightly green apples. The flavor is no less satisfying, superbly balanced and persistent. The aftertaste is delicate.

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MONTEPULCIANO

Italy

Brilliant, attractive and warm ruby-red colour. Ample and remarkably complex, with vinous and characteristic tones. Dry on the palate and gracious, with delicate and soft veining, a fine and harmonious balance.

Bubbly Bottles

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GLERA

Veneto, Italy

Bright pale straw-yellow; A fine, clear mousse with attractively intense, very fruity and aromatic, with hints of wisteria flowers and Rennet apples. Very well-balanced and appealing, with the extremely delicate almond note that is typical of Glera.

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CHARDONNAY

Champagne, France

In the heart of the chalk wonderland that is Le Mesnil-sur-Oger, Didier Vergnon and his son Clement are the 4th and 5th generations to lead this small 5-hectare estate. Classic Côte des Blancs Chardonnay, with everything you want from the terroir. Crisp green apple, with a vertical nose. The front end is warm and chalky front with an impressive weight of green fruit on the palate and a really nice sugar delivery.

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SAUVIGNON BLANC

Wairau Valley, New Zealand

This organically grown wine is when French know-how meets New Zealand terroir. Domaine Laporte of Sancerre in Loire, France have fused the terroir of Marlborough, New Zealand with their historical know-how, producing a wine of luscious fruit and lovely roundness. Both subtle and intense in the mouth, this wine expresses a pleasant freshness, allied to delicate notes of ripe fruit such as apricot or pineapple.

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SAUVIGNON BLANC

Colchagua, Chile

Los Vascos is located in the Colchagua region, Chile. Nestled between the Andes and the Coastal Mountain Range. Owned by Barons de Rothschild (Lafite) it combines Chilean traditions with DBR Lafite's heritage and expertise. This wine presents a pale yellow colour with glints of green, aromas of melon, green apple, pineapple, and lime are underscored by spicy, herby notes such as lemongrass and lemon verbena.

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RIESLING

Mosel, Germany

Pronounced bite of acidic tension and a salty tang on the finish, which works brilliantly with the slaty minerality. The precise finish is rounded out by a lovely fleshy fruit residue coating the palate. Textbook high quality Kabinett, seriously good.



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GRENACHE BLANC

Rhone, France

Delicate nose with notes of white flowers and citrus. Well balanced in the mouth, it is fresh, with great vivacity and a hint of bitterness with salty aromas. Nice length.

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CHARDONNAY

Colchagua, Chile

Another white from Los Vascos owned by Barons de Rothschild (Lafite). This wine has a beautiful pale bright yellow. The nose offers the distinctive pineapple, peach, and banana scents of this variety, as well as notes of pear, grapefruit, and elegant floral aromas. Rich, creamy texture, good length, and excellent acidity.

CHARDONNAY

Piedmont, Italy

'L'Altro' is the Italian version for 'The Other'. This wine is named 'L'Altro' in order to distinguish it from the first Chardonnay ever produced - Piodilei. Very fresh and fruity, with great minerality and a slight vanilla note.

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CHARDONNAY

Burgundy, France

The Carillon family have been growing grapes in Puligny-Montrachet, south of Côte de Beaune for almost 500 years. In 2010, the estate was split between the two brothers, Francois and Jacques and since then Francois has been blazing his own path. We present this Bourgogne from his boutique estate.



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Red Bottles

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SHIRAZ

Clare Valley, Australia

Sevenhill was established in 1851 when the Jesuits who settled in the area planted vines to produce sacramental wine. It is the first winery in the Clare Valley and one of the oldest in Australia. This Shiraz is sourced from nine individual blocks with some of these blocks over 100 years ago and several planted in the 1970's. Impressive depth of colour. Aromas of toasted nuts, coffee and spice, combined with dark fruits, juniper berry and prunes. The fruit sweetness is well-integrated, with gritty tannins and a fine, long savoury finish.

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SHIRAZ

Frankland River, Australia

This wine is made with fruit from the Frankland River Region of Western Australia, which produces wine with great richness of flavour. Displays lovely mulberry, mocha and spicy notes. The palate is luscious with cherry and plum flavours, supported by smooth tannins.

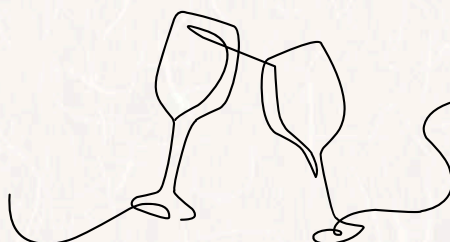
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GRENACHE, MOURVEDRE, SYRAH

Rhone, France

Pretty deep colour. The nose offers a beautiful aromatic complexity, marked by Grenache and a hint of blackcurrant brought by the ripe Syrah. On the palate, it shows complexity with tannins still present, but with finesse and elegance, and a beautiful freshness.



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MALBEC, CABERNET SAUVIGNON

Mendoza, Argentina

Deep velvety red color with intense ruby hues. Very fruity and fresh on the nose, followed by aromas of red fruit, strawberry and black currant. On the palate, the wine is long, well balanced and pleasant, with refined tannins. Displaying generous aromas of red berries.

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CABERNET SAUVIGNON, MERLOT, CABERNET FRANC, SYRAH

Stellenbosch, South Africa

Stellenbosch is arguably the winemaking hub of South Africa. Glenelly, with its roots in French viticulture and vineyards on the slopes of Simonsberg Mountain, has truly tapped into the potential of the terroir here. The Estate Reserve Red is Glenelly's signature blend. Supple and rich in the mouth, this wine is bursting with flavors of ripe, dark berries, floral spice, shaved cocoa and a hint of roasted pepper.

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CABERNET FRANC

Colchagua, Chile

Los Vascos wines try to bring a bit of the Lafite tradition to the terroir of Chile. The property is the vision of Barons de Rothschild (Lafite), who arrived in Chile in 1988. This 100% Cabernet Franc stands out for its deep crimson colour and aroma of dark fruit, cherry and spice. On the palate, it offers a full and well-balanced body with notes of blackcurrant, raspberry and vanilla. The wine has been aged for 18 months in oak barrels, which gives it a touch of smoky complexity.



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GRENACHE**Languedoc-Roussillon, France**

This juicy grenache from the heart of Languedoc reflects the complexity and richness of the great terroirs of the south of France. It has wild blackberry, wild strawberry and more slightly wild redcurrants associated with touches of liquorice, rosemary, scrubland, an almost minty touch. It has a seductive full-to medium-bodied with attractive fruit and a fresh finish.

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BARBERA**Piedmont, Italy**

The Barbera grapes are sourced from the Barolo and Barbaresco region. A classic Barbera with a uniquely great structure, full-bodied, complex, smooth character, ripe fruit, spices and a very long life.

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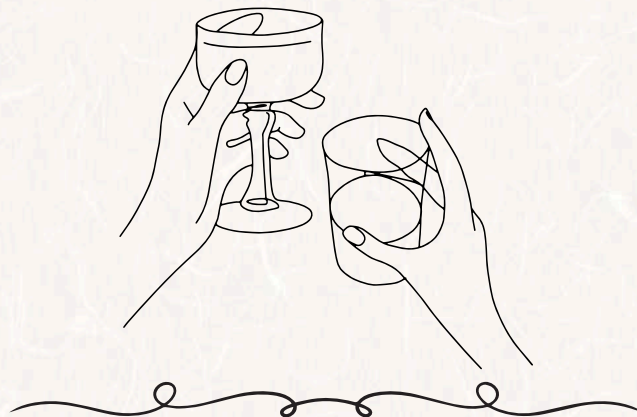
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SANGIOVESE**Tuscany, Italy**

This elegant wine is made entirely from the Sangiovese grape, which is known for its acidic, tannic nature. The wine is aged for 18 months in French oak barrels to attain an appealing complexity. Rich ruby-red colour, juicy cherry, raspberry and spicy aromas with hints of Mediterranean herbs and floral notes on the nose. Medium bodied with soft and juicy tannins on the palate and a fresh and velvet finish.



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SANGIOVESE

Tuscany, Italy

Rosso di Montalcino, often called the “baby Brunello” was recognized as a DOC in 1984, proposing itself as a more agile and equally excellent wine compared to its older brother Brunello. Tenuta Ridolfi’s vineyards are on the North-East slope of the Montalcino hill. Made from 100% Sangiovese the wine was aged for 12 months in large Slavonian oak barrels.

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GRENACHE, MOURVÈDRE, AND SYRAH

Rhone, France

Moulin de La Gardette is located in a spot reputed since as early as 1670 for the quality of its vineyards on the rocky slopes of la Gardette, just to the south of the village of Gigondas. Jean-Baptiste Meunier is a fifth-generation vineyard owner and he makes just 3 wines and the Tradition which we are presenting is his flagship.

PINOT NOIR

Burgundy, France

Brothers Marc-Emmanuel and Olivier Cyrot are the fourth winemaking generation of this family domaine. This Bourgogne comes from declassified Pommard vineyards. Great value! This delicious

Pinot has a wonderfully perfumed nose immediately inviting you in and offers a burst of juicy strawberry and red cherry flavours on the palate. It’s fresh and vibrant and, while tasty now, will no doubt continue to age well in bottles.



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CABERNET SAUVIGNON, MERLOT, CABERNET FRANC, PETIT VERDOT

Tuscany, Italy

In 2003, Glenelly was bought by May-Eliane de Lencquesaing, who for over 30 years, had been the owner of the classed growth Bordeaux, Château Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande in Pauillac. Named after her, Lady May is Glenelly's flagship wine. Expect to taste flavours of cassis, blackcurrant, dark cherry, a touch of graphite and delicate, spicy plum fruit. Fresh and vibrant, Lady May is the definitive introduction to Glenelly's terroir.

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NERELLO MASCALESE

Tuscany, Italy

The winery sits at about a thousand meters of altitude above the small wine town of Passopisciaro on the northern slope of Mount Etna, an active volcano in northeastern Sicily. At Passopisciaro, Andrea Franchetti focuses on the native grape Nerello Mascalese and its various expressions of terroir and altitudes through a series of crus or Contrade. Nerello Mascalese is native to the Mount Etna region and is often compared to Pinot Noir due to its light color, high acidity, and elegant structure.

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CORVINA

Veneto, Italy

Amarone needs no introduction and is widely recognized as one of Italy's iconic red wines. The process used to make Amarone is known as *appassimento*, in which the harvested grapes are air-dried in a temperature and humidity-controlled room for about three months. The resulting grapes lose much of their natural water, and shrivel, looking a bit like raisins resulting in a powerful wine of almost 16% alcohol content and more.

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MERLOT, CABERNET SAUVIGNON, CABERNET FRANC

St Emillon, France

Château Quinault is in the heart of Libourne, St Emillon. Under Pierre Lurton of Château Cheval Blanc, the goal is to imitate the viticulture, winemaking, and aging process of its more famous brother Chateau. Terroir of Château Quinault l'Enclos is spread over 20 hectares of sand and pebbles mixed with a little clay. The vine plants are on average 45 years old, are 71.5% Merlot, 14.5% Cabernet Franc, and 14% Cabernet Sauvignon, typical of the varieties in the region.

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TEMPRANILLO

Rioja, Spain

The single plot Valdegines is located in Laguardia in Rioja Alavesa and was 100% planted with Tempranillo in 1989. The site has a steep slope with a low support of sand and clay over the limestone. The nose is incredibly dark, deep and seductive. A little cinnamon, as well as delicate hints of coconut and black pepper lie above the fruit. On the palate, it is compact and full-bodied. Literally a "mouthful of wine", but in the best possible way.

In addition to the juicy fruit, it presents a very fine tannin.



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
